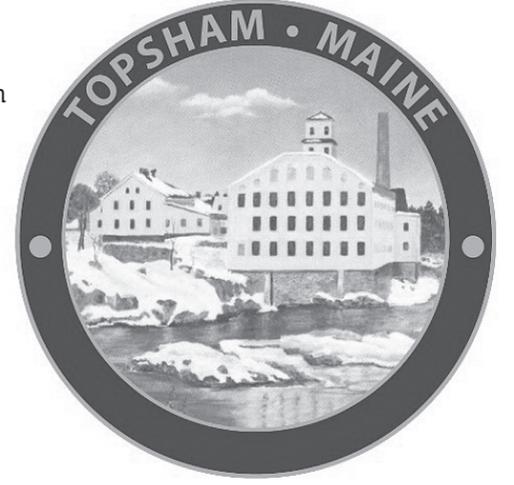

Article 5 - To see if the Town will vote to (1) approve the purchases of the following pieces of equipment: three Plow Truck Units, one Ambulance and one Fire Department Engine (the "Project"); (2) appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,335,000 for the costs of the Project; and (3) to fund this appropriation (a) authorize the Treasurer and the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen to borrow money through a lease purchase arrangement or to issue, at one time or from time to time, general obligation securities of the Town of Topsham, Maine, including temporary notes in anticipation of the sale thereof and refunding obligations, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$1,335,000 and to delegate to the Treasurer and Chairman of the Board of Selectmen the authority and discretion to fix the date(s), maturity(ies), denomination(s), interest rate(s), places(s) of payment, call(s) for redemption, current or advance refunding(s) of the securities, form(s), and other details of said securities, including execution and delivery of said securities against payment therefore, execution of certificates, loan agreements and any other documents reasonably related thereto, and to provide for the sale thereof.

225-6
DWELLING

Any building or structure or portion thereof designed or used for residential purposes.

- A. SINGLE-FAMILY DWELLING: ~~Any structure~~ A building containing only one dwelling unit for occupation by not more than one family.
- B. TWO-FAMILY DWELLING: A building containing only two dwelling units for occupation by not more than two families.
- C. MULTIFAMILY DWELLING: A building containing three or more dwelling units, such building being designed exclusively for residential use and occupancy by three or more families living independently of one another, with the number of families not exceeding the number of dwelling units.

NONCONFORMING STRUCTURE

A structure that does not meet ~~at~~ any one or more of the following dimensional requirements: setbacks, height and lot coverage. It is allowed solely because it was in lawful existence at the time this chapter or subsequent amendments took effect.

Article 11 - To see if the Voters will adopt an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to amend the Town Code, Chapter 225-14, nonconforming uses, structures, and lots of record by clarifying standards for the conformance of nonconforming structures."

§ 225-14 Nonconforming uses, structures and lots of record.

A. General.

(1) Continuance, enlargement and reconstruction. Any nonconforming use or structure may be continued but may not be extended, reconstructed, enlarged or structurally altered except as specified below by this chapter or as required by Federal, State or local codes, rules or laws.

C. Nonconforming structures. (This subsection pertains to dimensional requirements. Applications regarding nonconforming use shall be reviewed under the provisions above.)

(1) Enlargements controlled.

(a) ~~An existing structure that does not meet the required setbacks one or more of the dimensional requirements of the zone, may be expanded vertically and horizontally as long as no portion of the expansion is any closer to the property line than does not increase the nonconformity of the existing structure or create a new nonconformity. In no case shall enlargement result in a separation of less than 15 feet to adjacent structures. [Amended 1-23-2008 STM, Art. 2]~~

225-16 - Table of Uses

Mixed Use Building - Permitted (P) in all zones with footnote 26, add footnote 22 to LI, VC, & LV

Dwelling, Single Family – Not Permitted (X) in VC zone with added footnote 22

Schools – Permitted (P) in the R4 zone

FOOTNOTES:

26 - Uses within a mixed use building are permitted when permitted in the underlying zoning district or conditional when conditional in the underlying zoning district.

E. Detached storage buildings accessory to residential uses. The minimum side and rear setback requirement shall be ~~five~~ 5 feet in the R-1 Urban Residential Zone and 10 feet in the R-2 Suburban Residential and R-3 Rural Residential Zones and cannot be further reduced except by variance. The maximum height for such buildings shall be 12 feet. The maximum floor area for such buildings shall be 150 square feet

M.S.A.D. No. 75 Budget Process

Voting on the M.S.A.D. No. 75 budget is a two step process.

District Budget Meeting

The District must first hold a District Budget meeting, where voters will vote on the warrant articles. Each article will be presented to those present for a show of hands vote or a secret ballot vote. The meeting will end when all articles pass. All articles are subject to amendment.

The District Budget Meeting is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, May 26th, 2016 at the Orion Performing Arts Center at Mt. Ararat Middle School in Topsham.

Budget Validation Referendum

Within 30 calendar days, the District must hold a Referendum on the decision made at the District Budget Meeting. The Referendum will have two warrant articles and will ask if the voters wish to continue with the budget validation referendum for three more years and will ask the voters to vote on the final budget amount as approved at the District Budget Meeting. The article will not state the specific amount of the final budget, because time does not permit the printing and distribution of absentee ballots. However, the amount will be posted in the polling area and in the polling booth. The Budget Validation Referendum will be held on Tuesday, June 14th, 2016 at the voting sites in the towns. Topsham's vote will be held in the Exhibition Hall at the Topsham Fairgrounds.
