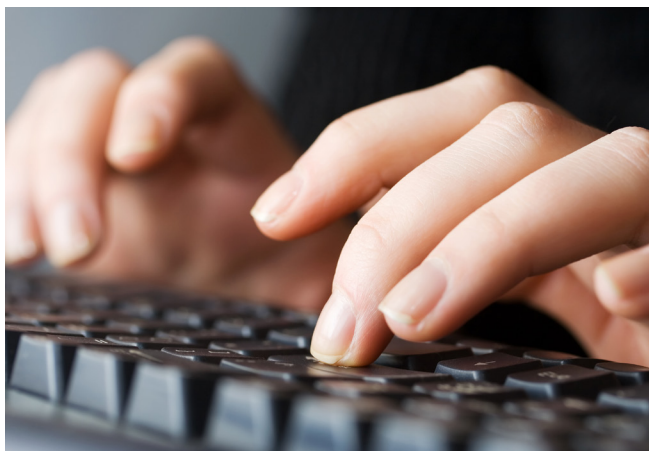
Maine SNAP E&T helps SNAP recipients get job training and education so they can find and keep good paying jobs. There are a lot of opportunities available to you at no cost.
