

# Foreside Recreation Area





The black-capped chickadee is the state bird of Maine. Mixed species forests (deciduous and conifer trees), such as the Foreside Recreation Area forest, are the chickadee's preferred habitat. Listen for their distinct "chicka-dee-dee-dee"

Adopted as the Maine State flower in 1895, the pine cone and tassel belong to the white pine tree (*Pinus Strobus*). This tree is considered the largest of the Northeast conifers (cone bearing trees) and has a long rich history within Maine. How can you distinguish the white pine from other conifers?


